Disparity Study Objectives

- Comply with the constitutional mandate and the DBE program regulations to ensure IDOT's DBE program remains narrowly tailored
- Provide a defense if IDOT's implementation of 49 C.F.R. Part 26 is challenged
- Develop accurate data for triennial and contract goal setting
- Gather feedback for program improvements
- Educate elected officials, IDOT staff, assist agencies and business owners on these issues



Dedicated Study Website

- Dedicated study website is updated throughout the process
- Materials to increase public understanding of, and participation in, the study process
- Answer inquiries and provide updates
- Website tabs
 - Elements of the study
 - FAQ sheet
 - Team member bios
 - Information about how to participate
 - Contact and comment information



Legal Analysis

- Review current case law, other relevant legal documents, with emphasis on 7th Circuit decisions
- Review 49 C.F.R. Part 26 and USDOT Guidance
- Describe the legal standards and how the research methodology conforms to the case law
- Explain how the legal principles apply to each study element
- Objectives
 - Educate the reader about the legal standards
 - Provide a framework for a court in litigation



- Study period is October 1, 2016 September 30, 2021
- Analyze all formally procured construction and engineering contracts \$50,000 or greater
- Five funding sources
 - Federal Highway Administration
 - Federal Transit Administration
 - Federal Aviation Administration
 - Federal Railroad Administration
 - State



- Develop Initial Contract Data Files
 - Step 1: Gather IDOT's prime contracts to create the Initial Contract Data Files
 - Step 2: Develop sample from Initial Contract Data Files
 - Step 3: Gather additional data for contracts in the Sample Contract Data Files



- Develop Final Contract Data Files
 - Step 1: Contact primes for missing subcontractor data
 - Collect at least 80% of the contract dollars
 - Step 2: Assign missing race and gender status and NAICS codes
 - Based on actual scope of work of specific contracts, as firms may provide multiple services
 - Step 3: Research Illinois location of any firm with outof-state address



- Determine IDOT's industry market
 - Determine the industry market, disaggregated by funding source, by NAICS codes for at least 75% of the contracts
 - Limit further analysis to firms in the designated codes
- Determine IDOT's geographic market area
 - Determine the geographic market, disaggregated by funding source, by contiguous counties for at least 75% of the contracts
 - Limit further analysis to firms in the designated counties



Determination of IDOT's DBE Utilization

- Produce the Contract Data Utilization Analysis
 - Develop Contract Data Utilization Files
 - Disaggregate results by funding source
 - Provide utilization by race and gender aggregated across all industry codes
 - Provide utilization by race and gender disaggregated by six-digit NAICS codes



Estimation of DBE Availability

Availability sources

- Master D/M/WBE Directory
 - UCP directories; other Illinois government directories; private sector listings
- Master Business List of IDOT prime and subcontractors from Contract Data Utilization Files; Bidders List; other IDOT lists
- Hoovers for business universe of firms in the market area sorted by NAICS codes and location
- Availability determination
 - Assign missing race or gender status and six-digit NAICS codes in Master Directory and Master Business List
 - Merge sources



Estimation of DBE Availability

- Produce unweighted availability disaggregated by race, gender and industry codes
 - Unweighted six-digit results can be used for narrowly tailored contract goal setting
- Produce weighted availability by race and gender aggregated across all industry codes
 - Weighted result can be used for Step 1 baseline estimate for DBE Triennial Goal submissions



Analysis of Disparities in DBE Utilization

- Disparity ratio = DBE utilization ÷ weighted availability
- Calculate disparity indices for all race and sex groups aggregated across all industry groups for state funded contracts
 - Calculate statistical significance
 - Calculate substantive significance
- Examine whether disparities are the result of discrimination or some other factors
 - Are DBE contract goals needed to ensure a level playing field?



Analysis of Overconcentration of DBEs

- Examine specific codes with ratios over 100% to look for patterns
 - Do the results reflect the success of a few DBEs?
 - Step 1
 - Identify codes over 100%
 - Identify codes where DBEs received a large share of dollars
 - Step 2
 - Compare outcomes by group
 - Compare outcomes by codes
 - Gather anecdotal data on firm and industry concentration



Economy-Wide Disparity Analyses

- Census Bureau data sources
 - Compare M/WBEs' formation rates and business earnings to non-M/WBEs' rates using the American Community Survey
 - Possible basis for step 2 adjustment under §26.45(d)
 - Compare M/WBEs' revenues to non-M/WBEs' revenues using the Annual Business Survey
- Extensive government and academic reports on discrimination in market for commercial credit
- Critical for evaluation of effectiveness of raceneutral measures



Anecdotal Data Analyses

- Develop invitation and outreach lists for extensive follow-up by subconsultants
- Utilize study website, invitations, meeting attendance, traditional and social media, etc.
- Gather evidence and input through:
 - Public informational webinar
 - Electronic survey of business owners
 - Stakeholder organization group interviews
 - Small group business owner interviews grouped by industry and DBE status
 - Written comments
- Review judicial or administrative opinions or data



Anecdotal Data Analyses

Possible topics

- Equal access to networks and information
- Biased perceptions and stereotypes
- Workplace harassment or hostile work environments
- Experiences with barriers to equal access to prime and subcontracting opportunities
- Barriers to obtaining business credit, surety bonds insurance coverage, etc.
- Impact of experience and specification requirements
- Unequal payments or performance standards



Review of IDOT's DBE Program

- Review and evaluate program elements
 - Certification process
 - Outreach and access to information
 - Contract goal setting
 - DBE compliance
 - Small business elements
 - Supportive services offerings

Process

- Review documents
- Interview stakeholder groups, business owners and IDOT staff
- Surveys



USDOT DBE Goal Submissions

- CHA will be responsible for defining, researching, compiling and analyzing all required data by mode
 - Determination of step I base figures using study results
 - Recommend any adjustments under step 2
 - Past DBE participation
 - Other information
 - Estimate race-neutral vs. race-conscious attainment
 - Propose triennial goals for FHWA, FTA and FAA programs
- Draft goal submission documents
- Work with IDOT to address any USDOT concerns



Findings and Recommendations

- Provide recommendations for race-neutral measures based on study results
- Provide recommendations for race-conscious remedies if supported by the study findings, including a goal setting methodology
